





## **Stroke Faculty Job posting**

The Department of Neurology at Massachusetts General Hospital is seeking an ABPN certified/eligible academic Vascular Neurologist to join the Stroke Division and the faculty of Harvard Medical School. Areas of particular interest include acute stroke, clinical care, telestroke, and clinical trials.

The applicant will be expected to be clinically active and to teach and supervise medical students, Neurology Residents and Stroke Fellows. The successful candidate will integrate with the Divisions internationally renowned cross-disciplinary efforts. Although substantial direct clinical, teaching and research experience would be advantageous, less experienced candidates with exceptional promise will also be considered.

The candidate will play a prominent role in the continuum of stroke care (Acute Stroke/Telestroke consultations, inpatient, outpatient, applied stroke research/clinical stroke trials). The candidate will have an opportunity to participate in programmatic leadership and to work closely with the ACGME-accredited Vascular Neurology fellows and the Harvard Neurology Residents. Leadership opportunities in administration of the MGH Comprehensive Stroke Center and Acute Stroke Program will be available to a candidate with appropriate level of expertise and experience.

Appointment as an Instructor, Assistant Professor, or Associate Professor at Harvard Medical School along with a corresponding hospital appointment will be commensurate with experience, training, and achievements. Suitable candidates will have an MD or an MD-PhD, and Board Certifications in Neurology and Vascular Neurology or equivalent training.
