Tourette Syndrome is a neurodevelopmental disorder characterized by chronic motor and vocal tics. It is frequently associated with high rates of co-occurring neuropsychiatric conditions that are ‘hidden’ and can be more disabling than the tics themselves. This presentation will cover the diagnosis and treatment of Tourette Syndrome and related tic disorders.

Dr. Dy-Hollins is a pediatric neurologist who specializes in pediatric movement disorders. She is the director of the Pediatric Movement Disorders Program at Mass General and Assistant Professor of Neurology at Harvard Medical School. She also sees patients with tic disorders at the Mass General Tourette Syndrome Center of Excellence.
