WELCOME TO THE RADIATION ONCOLOGY GROUP ACUPUNCTURE! This Integrative Therapy is provided to you by the Katherine A. Gallagher Integrative Therapies Program and your Radiation Oncology Team

## **Before Your Appointment**

- You must have written approval from your Radiation Oncology team (RN, NP, MD) prior to starting acupuncture.
- Have something light to eat before treatment. You do not want to have a totally empty or totally full stomach.
- Wear loose, comfortable clothing so you can roll up your sleeves, or pant legs if needed.
- Please remember to silence all electronic devices *BEFORE* you come into the treatment room. Other people may be sleeping or relaxing. We want to create a healing environment and we try to keep noise to a minimum.
- Sessions are usually 45 minutes long; please inform your acupuncturist when you arrive if you have to leave at a certain time.
- Due to the large volume of patients we cannot accommodate "drop-ins".

## Group Acupuncture Session

- You will receive your acupuncture treatment in a quiet group environment. Our treatment room has a capacity of five patients. Please feel free to sit in any available recliner when you arrive.
- Group Acupuncture is held on Lunder Lower Level 2 (LL2) in Patient waiting Room D. Please report directly to this room for your appointment.
- Your acupuncturist will briefly talk with you about your symptoms and health concerns.
- As part of the assessment, the acupuncturist will take your pulse and look at your tongue. During the session, you will remain fully clothed, but will remove your shoes and socks.
- Hair-thin, sterile, disposable pins will be inserted in different locations on your body based on your Asian Medicine diagnosis. Upon insertion, you may feel a slight pinch, tingling, or an electrical sensation. Once the pins are in place, most patients feel very relaxed or even fall asleep.
- Acupuncture is intended to help you manage side effects and symptoms associated with radiation therapy.
- You do not need to check out with anyone after your session.

## Follow-up Appointments

- Your acupuncturist will develop a treatment plan with you outlining the number and recommended frequency of acupuncture sessions. After your initial visit, please call our Patient Coordinator, Holly Chartrand, at 617-726-4178 to schedule your follow up appointments.
- We have very limited appointment availability, so please let Holly know if you need to cancel so that we may contact patients on our waiting list.

**Remember**: Complementary therapies have a cumulative effect. This means it may take several treatments for you to notice any changes. Be patient with the process.
