Scott D. Martin, MD currently serves as an Associate Professor in Orthopaedic Surgery, as the Director of the Joint Preservation Service, and as the Director of the Sports Medicine Fellowship in the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery at the Massachusetts General Hospital. He completed medical school at Thomas Jefferson University, an orthopaedic surgery residency at Hospital for Special Surgery, and did two fellowships, one in Arthroplasty at Brigham & Women's Hospital, and one in Sports at the American Sports Medicine Institute.

Dr. Martin served as an attending at the University of Minnesota for a year and half before joining Brigham & Women's Hospital in 1995, where he built a Sports Medicine program where none existed. Academically, he has served as the Director of the Anatomy Course for HCORP and participated in HCORP's CORE curriculum. His research interests include joint preservation of the hip, knee, and shoulder. Currently, his research is focused on the use of autologous mesenchymal stem cell application in the hip that will potentially regenerate cartilage.

Dr. Martin enjoys collaborating with fellow researchers, both in clinical medicine and basic science, including Dr. Jeffrey Katz (Brigham & Women's), Dr. Jenna Galloway (MGH), and Dr. Gus Mazzocca (UConn).
