The United States ranks second in the world in carbon emissions and fourth in greenhouse gas emissions related to diet. Moreover, malnutrition (both **obesity** and **undernutrition**) and **climate change** can be described as a *global syndemic* – three pandemics that affect most people worldwide – because of their interactions, adverse effects on each other, and common underlying factors they have on social and economic health.

This talk will explore the impact of climate change on food access and nutrition and will discuss individual and policy-focused recommendations to address these intersecting threats to public health.
