### Featured Speaker: Molly Colvin, PhD, ABPP

Dr. Colvin is the director of the Learning and Emotional Assessment Program (LEAP) at Mass General and an Assistant Professor of Psychology at Harvard Medical School. She specializes in the neuropsychological assessment of neurodevelopmental disorders, emphasizing a “whole-child approach” that promotes healthy social, emotional, and cognitive development by improving caregiver understanding and access to resources.
