The Mass General Summer Research Trainee Program (SRTP) seeks to inspire students who are underrepresented in medicine (UIM)\* to consider careers in academic medicine and/or biomedical research by immersing them in cutting-edge research opportunities.

<b>December 1, 2021 @6pm ET</b>	Attend <b>SRTP Info Session/Alumni Panel</b> – get your SRTP questions answered! <a href="#">Register in advance</a> .
<b>November 2021 – January 24, 2021</b>	<p>Upload all required materials to your SRTP account:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Resume/CV</li> <li>• Personal statement draft</li> <li>• Request for two letters of recommendation</li> <li>• Official Transcripts <i>and</i> Unofficial Transcripts from college, graduate, and/or medical schools attend(ed)             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Official transcripts must be sent electronically or received by our office at least one day before the deadline. Both are required due to operations protocol. If the medical school transcript is not available then a letter of good standing is required.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Letter of Good Standing             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Only required for those in medical school if medical school transcripts are not yet available.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<b>By January 24, 2022, 5pm E.T.</b>	Submit completed application <i>Incomplete applications will not be reviewed.</i>
<b>January 24, 2022 – February 16, 2022</b>	Completed applications are reviewed by Review Committee
<b>February 16, 2022</b>	Review Committee notifies accepted students of their acceptance
<b>May 23, 2022</b>	Receive access to trainings requested by preceptors.
<b>June 6, 2022 – July 29, 2022</b>	SRTP takes place!

\*Underrepresented in medicine (UIM) for the purpose of this program are those individuals belonging to a particular ethnic or racial group which has been considered by the National Institute of Health (NIH) and the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC) to be underrepresented in biomedical research (relative to their numbers in the general population).
