

The Fred W. Stewart Award of Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center
Honors Robert H. Young, MD

The prestigious Fred W. Stewart Award of Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, New York, was bestowed on October 16, 2015, to Robert H. Young, MD, Director of the Massachusetts General Hospital Gynecologic and Urologic pathology groups and Robert E. Scully Professor of Pathology at Harvard Medical School. Each year the award honors a pathologist who has made outstanding contributions in advancing knowledge of human cancer.

Dr. Young has been at the Massachusetts General Hospital for almost 40 years and is recognized worldwide for his contribution in the fields of gynecological pathology (particularly tumor of the ovaries) and the urinary system (particularly testicular and urinary bladder tumors and their mimics). Dr. Young is only the second MGH pathologist after Dr. Robert E. Scully in 1980 to receive this award in recognition of his contribution to diagnosis and patient care.
