Residency Training Program in Laboratory Animal Medicine and Management (LAMM)

The MGH CCM LAMM training program is a 3 year program that exposes a veterinarian to all the classical components of a traditional laboratory animal medicine residency with an additional emphasis on management.



Hands-on Experience

- Trainees provide routine and emergency clinical care to rodent and non-rodent species in a AAALAC accredited institution that supports the work of the largest hospitalbased research program in the US.

- Trainees are exposed to IACUC processes and practices.

- Trainees experience situations and scenarios that are dealt with by senior managers and leadership members.



Didactic Component

- Trainees join neighboring Boston-based MIT institution for clinical conferences and discussions.

- Classes in management and managerial skills are led by department chairs of MGH and Harvard Faculty of Arts and Science.

Research Opportunity

- Time is allotted for trainees to perform mentor-guided research.

- Research opportunities that employ the scientific method but also work to further a managerial topic are encouraged.
