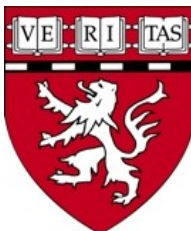

John H. Healey, MD, FACS was educated at Yale and University of Vermont. He has been in NYC at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center as Chief of Orthopaedic Surgery, the Hospital for Special Surgery, and Professor at Cornell. He is a world leading surgical specialist in the treatment of bone and soft tissue sarcomas.

He is an international leader serving as a Board Member of Make-It-Better, many other academic societies, and President of the International Society of Limb Salvage, Musculoskeletal Tumor Society, and Association of Bone and Joint Surgeons.

Dr. Healey has published over 370 peer-reviewed articles, 50 chapters, and one text, and his osteosarcoma work has the most scientific citations. Dr. Healey conducts basic science research regarding osteosarcoma, funded by grants from the NIH, OREF and the American Cancer Society. He has been an editor for many leading scientific journals. Honored by his institution's annual teaching award many times, Dr. Healey has trained the leaders in tumor surgery worldwide.
